Based on the identified strong points from other European programmes (both bachelor and master studies), several recommendations are addressed in order to improve the quality and impact of Romanian programmes in European Studies. This process requires a comprehensive approach that focuses on four key factors: internationalization, accessibility, professional skills, and research capabilities. Drawing inspiration from the strong points identified in other European Studies programs across Europe, here are some recommendations:



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A) Internationalization:

This can be done through *multilingual approach* (introduce classes in English, French, and German to promote language diversity and attract students from various linguistic backgrounds; ensure a balance between languages, with some courses taught bilingually, reflecting the multilingual nature of Europe), but also *exchange programs* (establish partnerships with universities across Europe to facilitate student exchanges; encourage students to spend a semester abroad, promoting cross-cultural understanding and international collaboration). This particular approach can facilitate *dual degree programs* (develop dual-degree programs with reputable European universities to provide students with a broader academic experience). For example, explore partnerships with institutions like Trinity College Dublin or Columbia University, allowing students to earn degrees from both Romanian and international institutions. For the pro-orientated students, this approach can create *Internship Opportunities Abroad* (facilitate internships in European institutions, foreign embassies, and international organizations to expose students to a global work environment or collaborate with renowned organizations to ensure a diverse range of internship options).

B) Accessibility:

This dimension is focused on the *Open Admission Policies*, such as simplify admission processes for students of other nationalities, making it easier for them to enroll in the program or promote inclusivity by actively encouraging a diverse student body. Additionally, the action will be supported by *Language Support Services*, by providing language support services for non-native speakers to enhance their academic experience and by offering language courses and tutoring to help students improve their proficiency in the language of instruction.

C) Professional Skills:

The third key factor can be supported through *Professional Skills Courses* (Implement a course on professional skills similar to the one mentioned in the European Studies programs across Europe; Include modules on negotiation skills, communication, and practical skills relevant to careers in European institutions and international organizations) and through a mandatory *Policy Tools Semester* (Design a semester dedicated to practical training in policy tools, providing students with hands-on experience in analyzing and formulating policies).

D) Research Skills:

Finally, the fourth key factor can be achieved through solid actions during the entire duration of the programme, such as: i) Introduce a course specifically focused on research skills, emphasizing academic writing, independent research, and critical analysis; ii) Provide workshops and seminars on advanced research methodologies; iii) Encourage students to undertake independent research projects, fostering a culture of inquiry and critical thinking; iv) Establish mentorship programs with faculty members to guide students in their research endeavors.

Besides the key factors, the Romanian universities can integrate additional measure to enhance the attractiveness and impact of their Bachelor and Master programmes in European Studies, such as implementing a thematic approach with core focal points for each academic year, similar to the successful European Studies programs in Europe (focus on European diversity, unity, and Europe's place in the wider world in successive years), introducing specialized tracks, such as European Culture, History, Law, Economics, and East European Studies (to allow students to choose their track based on their interests and career aspirations), integrating internships (ensuring that students gain practical experience and exposure to the professional world), or organising regular sessions where alumni



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share their experiences and insights with current students (networking opportunities to bridge the gap between academic learning and real-world applications).

By incorporating these recommendations, the European Studies curricula in Romania can create a dynamic and internationally oriented learning environment, equipping students with the skills and knowledge needed for successful careers in the field.
